PREFACE

This Port Notice is issued pursuant to Section 57 of the *Ports Management Act 2015 (NT)*.

SCOPE

This Port Notice is to maintain and improve the safe, secure and efficient operation of Darwin Port facilities and operations.

DEFINITIONS

Term	Definition
Smoking	Means releasing smoke or fumes from an ignited tobacco product and includes holding or controlling an ignited tobacco product and simulating the experience of smoking by having a smoke like cartridge with a heater that vaporises liquid. This includes cigarettes, pipes, cigars and e-cigarettes.

DIRECTION

Smoking is banned within areas marked as “No Smoking” areas. No Smoking areas are identified by a red line painted, with *No Smoking* symbols, along the ground. These areas include:

- the length of the wharf deck or in any plant and equipment operating on the wharf deck;
- inside any buildings, Darwin Port vehicles, plant and equipment; and
- the Bulk Liquids Berth (BLB) and beyond.

There are **designated** Smoking areas that have been approved within the *No Smoking* areas of the Marine Supply Base and the Australian Border Force berth. These areas are identified with signage and smoking is only permitted within those areas.

REVIEW STATEMENT

This Port Notice will be reviewed biennially by the Port Management Officer or their delegate.
