# **Movement of Cargo at East Arm Wharf**

**1. TITLE**

Movement of cargoes on East Arm Wharf (EAW).

**2. REFERENCE LEGISLATION**

- *Ports Management Act 2015*
- *Work Health & Safety (National Uniform Legislation) Act 2011*

**3. SCOPE**

This notice applies to all stevedores, tenants, contractors and port users operating on EAW.

**4. PREFACE**

This Port Notice is issued pursuant to Section 57 of the *Ports Management Act*.

**5. DIRECTION**



The transport of 40-foot Containers, break bulk and out of gauge cargo to and from the common user yard and adjacent laydown areas using reach stackers and conventional forklifts is authorised to take place directly from the wharf to the common user precinct and along the wharf deck only. Above is the depiction of approved transport route, when break bulk and out of gauge operations occur, this area adjacent to the wharf road must be traffic managed by the respective stevedore.

Transiting of 40-foot Containers or any other cargo wider than a 20 – foot container through all other areas of EAW must be carried out using appropriate trailers or tractor / tow motors.

Movement of 40-foot Containers within areas operated by tenants is at their respective discretion.

**6. NON-COMPLIANCE**

Darwin Port reserves the right to remove persons from its facilities if it is found their actions or anticipated actions may reasonably cause a safety, environment, security or operational incident. A Darwin Port Enforcement Officer may, at any time, confiscate a port pass or certificate.

**7. REVIEW STATEMENT**

This direction will be reviewed biennially by the Port Management Officer.
